Infographics are short snippets of information that you might not otherwise know. The content of the infographics should be focused on one common item. It is important to include bite-sized information. In other words, it should be short and sweet. Throughout your yearbook, be sure to be consistent with fonts, bullet points, shapes, and images to convey your point to the reader. I would encourage you to play with the font sizes to call more attention to the infographics.

### How to make infographics

There are tons of sources online that can help you create an amazing infographic. If you have a Creative Cloud account, you can use Adobe Spark to create a stunning design. Even if you don't have access to use Spark, it's worth browsing their template page for ideas.

The free and extremely popular design site Canva offers more than 100 infographic templates, along with instructions on how to make a great infographic.

You can find plenty more instructions and ideas for creating great infographics in places like YouTube.

**Instructions:** Using Canva or a program of your choice, create one infographic. Your adviser may want you to create an infographic using your Online Design program. If you are using Canva, find infographics and templates. You can then upload photos for the project. You can also use the text tool, to change the type on the template and create the look you like. Once finished, you download a free watermark version of the design.

Possible topic suggestions:

- Create or use data collected on a sports team.
- Create or use data collected on popular movies or TV shows of the year.
- Create or use data collected on a science fair, fundraisers, or club activity.
- Create or use data collected on popular music of the year.
- Create or use data collected on popular stores or hangout spots.
