Instructions: Now is the time to take a moment to think about your school overview (**Mod 9, Part 4**), theme discovery (**Mod 9, Part 5**), theme search (**Mod 9, Part 6**). With theme development, we always begin with words or the verbal aspect of a great theme. Then we focus on the visual part of the theme. Always remember that a great theme is both verbal and visual.

At that time, you will design a cover, endsheets, divider, opening and closing spread. You will also be asked to write opening copy explaining your theme.
